### Texas State Festival

#### Need Cuers and Teachers in Tyler – June 10-13, 2021

Fellow Cuers and Teachers,

We need your help!

Linda and I have been asked to be the Round Dance Chairmen for this year's Texas State Square and Round Dance Festival. It will be held at the Harvey Convention Center in Tyler on June 10-13, 2021. The square dance leaders have said this festival is definitely "a go" for June. Hopefully by then the Covid-19 issues will be in our rear mirrors. We would like to put together an extensive round dance program but need as many of you as possible to help in order to do so.

The festivities start on Thursday night with a trail-in dance sponsored by the Texas State Callers Association. We want to have an informal trail-in round dance for about 2-2½ hours on Friday afternoon. The Friday evening dance will be presented by East Texas and hopefully it will be a 2+2, although we haven't officially heard that yet. For Saturday, the organizers have committed to two nice-sized halls for the round dancing directly across the main corridor from the square dance halls.

If possible, I would like to have Phase 2, 3, and square dance level 4 in one hall, and Phase 4, 5 and maybe a 6 or two in the other hall. We would like to have about 2½ hours of morning workshops featuring 4 or 5 dances, or possibly a figure/rhythm clinic if someone wanted to do that. I'm thinking two higher level dances and two or three in the lower-level hall. You could use anyone's choreography to teach, so you don't need to write a dance unless you want to.

In the afternoon and evening we would have about 2-2½ hours of dancing in each hall. As it currently stands, we would be having our own program on Saturday and will not be trying to coordinate our schedule with the squares, thus no rounds in the square dance halls Saturday evening.

So, my request is simple: please attend, please communicate to all your round dancers, even the advanced ones, that there will be dancing for all, and please let me know if you would be willing to cue and/or do a morning workshop on that Saturday. We are a bit late getting started on this project since things have been iffy for dancing, so I need to hear from you by March 15 to say if you can help. With 7½ hours each in two halls on Saturday, we need more than 6 cuers to help out, otherwise we will need to scale back our efforts.

It got to the point that the minute power came in we were cooking and eating, just in case we lost power again. Neighbors across the street were kind enough to bring soup over one day since they had a gas stove top. That was the day

we had power from about midnight to 7:00 in the morning. It warmed the house, but rather frustrating. One day we started breakfast and were just ready to put eggs in the fry pan when the power went off.

Our postman's truck slid into our mailboxes on Saturday morning the first day of delivery after the ice storm. Our next door neighbor's mailbox is located right next to ours and both boxes ended up extended inside the open door of his truck. How's that for luck? But he couldn't drive forward or he would take out the mailboxes with his truck, and he couldn't back up and turn the wheel to avoid the boxes either, because he didn't have traction. JL and our neighbor across the street grabbed a couple of shovels and after much discussion on how best to proceed helped chip out ice from underneath his back tires.

Finally the carrier was able to back up the mail truck while veering away from the curb, so all was well.

Then that same night a water main broke across the street right next door to our house. We were fortunate as the houses where the water was shutoff were all east of us. Our neighbors without water were also very fortunate as the repair was done the next day, although it took the crew the entire day to complete the repair. There were many breaks across the metroplex and we were quite surprised to see the repair crew out so quickly.

So now we are into normal Texas temperatures, but accessing plant loss. They say we won't know for awhile what plants we might have lost. The oak trees are dropping their leaves like mad right now. However, that is just speeding up the normal spring drop of live oaks. Some of our other plants look nipped, but only time will tell.
